ORDINANCE NO. 2207

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS EIGHT (8) AND TEN (10) OF ORDINANCE NO. 2190, THE SAME BEING ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A CITY PLANNING COMMISSION; PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE MEMBERS THEREOF; DEFINING THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF SAID COMMISSION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY."

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF THE CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY:

Section 1. That Section Eight (8) of Ordinance No. 2190 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 8. ( The said City Planning Commission shall consider and devise a general plan for the future growth and development of The City of Oklahoma City, by dividing as far as practicable the said City into districts for public buildings, factories, wholesale and retail and residence districts. The said City Planning Commission shall consider and devise plans for the opening of streets, the widening and grading of streets, avenues and boulevards for the purpose of establishing a uniform plan for street extensions. The Commission shall collect data and devise plans for the most efficacious manner of eliminating steam railroad tracks crossing the streets, avenues and boulevards of said city on the same grade of said streets, avenues and boulevards; shall collect data and devise plans and recommend the location of railroad stations in said city; shall collect data and devise plans for the straightening of North Canadian River through the said city; shall collect data and devise plans for the extension of the park system and recreation grounds within said city and outside of said city where said city has jurisdiction."

Section 2. That Section Ten (10) of Ordinance No. 2190 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 10. ( The Board of Commissioners of The City of Oklahoma City shall not extend, open or widen any streets, avenues or boulevards except to make extensions and additions thereto as the present pressing needs of the City may require, adopt any plan for the elimination of grade crossings or the construction of passenger depots for steam railroads, extend the park or recreation grounds system, or adopt any plan for the straightening of the North Canadian River, until such plan or plans shall have been submitted to the City Planning Commission and has been rec-

ommended by the City Planning Commission and approved by the City Planning Engineer."

*ant* Section 3. Whereas there has been heretofore <sup>created</sup> ~~granted~~ by resolution a Board known as "Public Sewerage Board", and whereas said board has collected a great amount of valuable data and is preparing recommendations and specifications for a sewer system for the City of Oklahoma City to adequately care for the sewage of said city; and whereas it is desired both by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Oklahoma City and the City Planning Commission of Oklahoma City that said Public Sewerage Board continue its work as heretofore begun; and whereas it is necessary to avoid conflict in the work and purposes of the said Public Sewerage Board and the City Planning Commission, in order that the work of each board may be adequately carried on; an immediate necessity exists for the amendment of Ordinance No. 2190, as above provided, in order to protect the public peace, public health and public safety; <sup>and</sup> an emergency is hereby declared to exist, whereby, for the preservation of the public peace, public health and public safety, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
